GAP Planning for the future

John Pea sent out a survey prior to the meeting to a selected group of GAP participants and all the GAP pastors, asking 4 questions. The results of that survey are on two separate attachments named *SWOT-Laity* and *SWOT-Pastors*. (SWOT means Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, and Troubles.)

John opened the discussion talking about Adaptive change. (See separate attachment named *Canoeing quotes*.) He referred to the book Christian Leadership in Uncharted Territory by Tod Bolsinger. Pneumatrix, which Union & Southminster are participating in, uses this book as a guide. GAP is at the peak of a mountain, needing to reinvent itself.

The attendees broke up into 4 small groups to review the responses and summarize the strengths & weaknesses between the 2 groups of responders'. After 15 minutes we gathered back into one group and the following were noted:

- Few do too much of work
- Repetitiveness
- Lack of variety of projects (2)
- Invisible to churches
- Lack of champions in churches
- Too many meetings
- Habitat too much energy

It was noted that leadership is a problem, because it changes every meeting. Suggested that a leadership component be added to the Organizational changes that were suggested from the Task Force meeting on 7/12/17. (See attachment *GAP Future Directions Task Force report2017*.) James Holeman, Charles Davenport, Libby Sigmon, & John Pea volunteered to meet prior to the February meeting to work out details of the expectations of the leadership. They will present a proposal to the group at the next meeting.
