Notes from the Past and Present

- GAP was formed, after the Evangelism Committee of the Presbytery held monthly meetings with the churches for Bible Study. At the end of that time, the churches were asked what they wanted to do and if they wanted to continue to meet. The congregations that had been meeting came up with the mission statement.
- Started up as a small church ministry & then added larger churches and ended up with all 16 county churches.

- Sponsor of Habitat House. Doing Social Ministry together. Those things that we can do in our local congregations better.
- o Provided officer training for those churches that don't provide their own.
- Communication has been a benefit. Literature for Sunday School shared among churches.
- Clergy Capers supported Grandfather Home. Wonderful time of BBQ, silent auction, & pastor talent show.
- Ad in newspaper for Christmas & Easter. Makes more affordable as cost is split between participating churches.
- Youth groups some churches would get together to do youth events. GAP
 Youth have recently done events for youth. Moderate to good results. Union &
 Lowell have mainly done events together lately. Transportation can be issue.
- Bible Schools flyer shared between churches for when Bible Schools are happening. Consider in future to get an ad in newspaper.

- How to build & attract millennials and getting them into "service" mode. Billy Robinson from Presbytery indicated that Building HOPE Campaign may have money available to sponsor a seminar on this topic if GAP asked for it.
